KEY HIGHLIGHTS: SINGAPORE ENERGY LECTURE, SIEW KEYNOTE ADDRESS, AND LEADERS DIALOGUE: ROAD TO NET ZERO

- In his 2023 <u>Singapore Energy Lecture</u>, <u>Minister Gan Kim Yong</u> for Trade and Industry emphasised the importance of resilient energy systems within this year's theme, "Energy Transition Towards A Net Zero World". With the window on meeting the 1.5°C global warming limit narrowing, he stressed the urgency and reiterated Singapore's commitment to the global decabonisation effort. He assured a "deliberate and coordinated approach" to a net zero future in collaboration with the global community, focusing on <u>infrastructure</u>, <u>markets</u>, and low carbon alternatives.
- Minister Gan also brought to attention two 2022 Request for Proposals (RFPs): one for a 600MW Combined Cycle Gas Turbine project to meet future energy needs, as well as a study to assess geothermal potential in the city-state. Additionally, he announced plans for a Central Gas Aggregator to streamline gas procurement for gencos. He also shared the results from the 2022 Expression of Interest for an Ammonia Power Generation and Bunkering Solution on Jurong Island. Six consortiums have been shortlisted to participate in an RFP. This will be one of the first commercial projects in the world to test and deploy the use of ammonia as a fuel, and will be an important milestone for Singapore's search for viable decarbonisation pathways.
- The <u>SIEW Keynote Address</u> featured <u>Francesco La Camera</u>, Director-General, International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA), who stressed that the next seven years will be critical to limit global warming to 1.5°C. He shared his vision for accelerating the pathways to net zero.
- Mr La Camera later joined <u>Dilhan Pillay Sandrasegara</u>, Executive Director and Chief Executive Officer, Temasek, in the inaugural <u>Leaders Dialogue: Road to Net Zero</u>, moderated by Sustainability Correspondent <u>Rachel Kelly</u>. The pressing question: How can we effectively navigate the ever-changing road to net zero for Asia? Their consensus emphasised the pivotal role of innovative financing and a just transition.
- In a <u>Special Session</u> on "Hydrogen as the Future of Net Zero Energy", panellists explored hydrogen's role in various sectors, and the challenges it faces. Topics included integrating hydrogen with low-carbon solutions, production and storage challenges, transitioning to hydrogen, and fostering international partnerships for hydrogen trade. <u>Hon. Reece Whitby MLA</u>, Minister for Environment; Climate Action; Racing and Gaming, Western Australia was among the panel speakers.
- The second edition of the **SIEW Energy Showcase** featured interactive exhibits exploring key initiatives and innovations driving Asia's transition towards a net zero future.
